Results of the Al Love Member-Member

Sixty-eight players competed in this years' Al Love Member-Member. The tournament in named in honor of one of the founding fathers of the Industry Hills Men's Golf Association. Al also served a term as President of the Southern California Golf Association. He, along with Otha Johnson and several other good men, made sure that we had a golf club that we all can be proud of.

The format was 36 holes of Better Ball of partners. The 68 players made for 42 teams. The Low Gross Championship came down to a tie between two teams at 134, nine under par. The teams were Steve Martin/Lindsay Jeffries and Mark Miller/Neil Moore. In most of our tournaments, there is a card-off to break ties. But the Al Love Member. Member has a permanent trophy, with room for only one team, so there was a playoff, and the play-by-play is listed below.

There are also Low Net winners in the Member-Member, and two of those teams qualify for the chance to play into the SCGA Four-ball Net Championship. If they make it though the qualifier(s), the Championship will be played 9/30-10/1 at the Glen Ivy Golf Club in Corona, Those teams (and their score) are Javier Murrieta/Brian Killeen (124) and Willian Ortega/Tim Tseng (126). Congratulations to all the winning teams!

Now, about the Playoff: on the first hole (#1 lke), Neil Moore and Steve Martin both hit second shots onto the green, Mark Miller was on in three. Lindsay Jeffries hit it into the bunker. Lindsay got up and down for the birdie. Neil two-putted for birdie. On the second hole (#2), Steve Martin drove the green. Mark Miller drove it over the green onto the cart path. Both Neil and Lindsay laid up and chipped onto the green, lying two. Mark chipped onto the green, lying two. Steve three-putted for par, then Lindsay two-putted for par. Neil sank a 15-foot downhill putt to win the playoff.

The Importance of Showing Up

There is apparently some confusion among a few Industry Hills members about completing the membership process. When you pay your \$149 dollars, you are buying an annual membership to the Industry Hills Golf Club. That entitles you to call earlier for tee times and makes you eligible to play in Men's Club tournaments. But there is a second step required to actually play in those events. You need to establish your Handicap with the Southern California Golf Association (SCGA). You have to pay the SCGA \$36 for your annual fee. Players without an official Handicap are not allowed in Men's Club tournaments.

It is possible to register your Handicap with the SCGA through another club. It's OK to have your primary membership at another club, but **you must still be a member of Industry Hills to play in tournaments**. Some men have paid their membership to the SCGA and listed Industry Hills as their club. But that isn't enough. You still have to pay the \$149 annual membership to Industry Hills to qualify for events.

Golf Is Way Harder Than You Think It Is

How hard is golf? Compared to the pros, playing golf on our courses is **a lot harder** for us. There is an article in the June 2024 issue of Golf Digest that analyzes the differences between pro golfers, playing with their ability, and amateur golfers playing with our ability.

Pro golfers average 300 yards off the tee, and play courses that average about 7,300 yards long. Almost no amateur golfer hits drives 300 yards; they're more like 230 yards. For an amateur to face the same degree of difficulty as the average pro, they should be playing a 5,142 yard course. (That's 10% shorter than the red tees on the lke.) But you drive it more than 230, you say. You routinely hit it 250. You should be playing a 5,589 yard course, a little longer than our reds. For the big hitters (270 yards), you should be playing a 6,036 yard course. These calculations were all done using actual data; no egos involved. By the way, the lke from the white tees plays 6,361 yards.

The point of the Golf Digest article is that maybe we would play faster in our tournaments if we played from tees that aligned with the difficulties that the touring pro faces.

Interesting side point: if Rory McElroy (326 yards) were playing the lke, he should be playing it at 9,200 yards.

Member-Member Pace of Play - Sunday

Sunday was worse. Four groups finished 11-18 minutes behind the group in front of them. The time between the first scorecard being turned in and the last was **66 minutes**. Not good.

Don't Be The Problem

When it comes to playing in Men's Club tournaments, 98% of the participants get it right. They sign up for the event. Show up for the event, play the round in a brisk manner and turn in their scorecard before taking their clubs out to the car.

The other 2% make us crazy.

There is a whole team of Men's Club Board Members who work a lot of hours to make our tournaments go smoothly. They send you messages about the upcoming tournament, inviting you to sign up. They send you reminder messages in case you forgot to sign up the first time. And then, Mister 2%, having <u>signed</u> up, you don't <u>show</u> up. You don't even call to say you can't make it.

Here's what makes us crazy: the tournament chairmen have already put the foursomes together. They've printed out scorecards and cart signs. They worked out all the math for the payouts to the Low Gross, Low Net and Skins Game winners. And because of YOU, everything they've done has to be done again. Which slows down the whole process of entering the scores, determining the winners, and re-calculating the prize money.

So: here are some phone numbers. Put them all in your Contacts list. So when that emergency comes up and you can't play in the tournament, you can call someone and tell them that. They will say "thank you for your consideration".
