Results of the Season Opener

Seventy players signed up for this year's Season Opener. The format was four-man teams, two Better Balls, on the Babe Zaharias course. Low Gross honors went to the team of Billy Hatton, Lindsay Jeffries, Les Farmer and Steve Martin, who carded a 5-under par score of 137, seven shots ahead of the next best score. (Two balls on the Babe would make a par of 142.)

Since there were only 18 teams in the tournament, there was only one Net Flight. Two teams tied at a score of 126, 16 under par. The winner of the card-off was the team of Jaime Arrieta, Mark Kusnier, Edson Prado and David Mastromatteo. Second place went to the team of Bryan Bedoy, Albert Gonzales, Prax Cruz and Jeff Parriott.

Note: seventy players signed up for the event, but only sixty-five played in it. **All** of the five men who were unable to make it to the tournament, **either called a Board Member or the Pro Shop to let them know that they would be unable to be there.** They have our thanks. The Importance of Showing Up

When it comes to playing in Men's Club tournaments, 98% of the participants get it right. They sign up for the event. Show up for the event, play the round in a brisk manner and turn in their scorecard before taking their clubs out to the car.

The other 2%, not so much..

There is a whole team of Men's Club Board Members who work a lot of hours to make our tournaments go smoothly. They send you messages about the upcoming tournament, inviting you to sign up. They send you reminder messages in case you forgot to sign up the first time. And then, *Mister 2%*, having signed up, you don't show up. You don't even call to say you can't make it.

Here's the problem: the tournament chairmen have already put the foursomes together. They've printed out scorecards and cart signs. They worked out all the math for the payouts to the Low Gross, Low Net and Skins Game winners. And because of YOU, everything they've done has to be done again. Which slows down the whole process of entering the scores, determining the winners, and recalculating the prize money.

So: here are some phone numbers. Put them all in your Contacts list. So when that emergency comes up and you can't play in the tournament, you can call someone and tell them that. They will say "thank you for your consideration".

Southern California Golf Assn. Team Play

One of the most popular SCGA programs, SCGA Team Play began in **1900** and has grown to include more than **230** clubs and **8,000** participants each year. Participating clubs may enter one 16-person team in a weekday league, a weekend league, or both, for each qualifying course they maintain. Leagues are divided in groups of four clubs, and the 16-person teams play a series of six home and away matches within their assigned league. The format is two-man teams on each side playing four-ball match play, a total of eight matches in each competition. Winners of each league then meet in single elimination playoffs, culminating in an 18-hole championship to determine the Southern California champion for that year.

The Four-ball Match Play format involves a two-man team playing an opponent's two-man team in a Better Ball match. There are a total of eight points up for grabs in each match: two points for the winner of the front nine, two points for the back nine and 4 points for the overall match. Teams that tie on either nine get one point each. Teams that tie in overall match get two points each. With eight matches in the competition, a total of 64 points is at stake.

The Industry Hills Thursday Team league includes the South Bay Pub Links, the Sons of St. Andrews and the Rio Hondo Golf Club. The Saturday team is short a team, so they will only play the La Mirada and Mountain Meadows golf clubs and have two Bye weeks.

The 2026 Performers' Classic

Participation in the Men's Club weekend tournaments earns you points in the Performers' Classic year-long competition. You earn 50 points for each day you participate in an event, and extra points (100 down to 10) for winning Low Gross, or finishing in the top 10 (Net) in a flight in that event. **The player who finishes with the most points will have his name engraved on the permanent Otha Johnson Cup trophy.** The top 25 point-getters, not counting Board Members or Advisors (in **bold type** below), will win a complimentary round of golf, lunch and a prize at the Performers' Classic tournament, plus a chance to win a one-year Premium Membership.

The Performers year starts with the **Fall Classic** in November and runs through the **Youpa Challenge** in October.
